The Jane Hotel

The Jane is a boutique hotel located at 505-507 West Street, with its main entrance at 113 Jane Street in the West Village section of the Greenwich Village neighborhood of Manhattan, New York City.

Great Value While the Jane, designed by Sean MacPherson ([the Bowery Hotel](#), the [Maritime Hotel](#)), is romantic in theory—an old riverfront building with tiny rooms modeled after European train sleeper cars. Bathrooms are shared and coed, which won't appeal to all travelers.

Ace Hotel

Located on 29th Street in a historic building dating back to 1904, the Ace Hotel rises 12 stories above Midtown Manhattan. The hotel boasts 260 guest rooms, many of which have vintage furniture and views of Broadway. Designed by New York-based firm Roman & Williams, the Ace has a truly unique design aesthetic: the lobby reflects the building's history with a mural of filmmaker and painter Harry Smith who lived in the building when it was the Breslin Hotel, while guest rooms have a more utilitarian feel, with repurposed pipes serving as everything from a makeshift closet to desk legs.

Stay Hotel

Urban chic is the theme at this Midtown Manhattan hotel, developed by hotelier Vikram Chatwal. The lobby boasts whimsical chandeliers and 18,000-gallon fish tank, while the compact guest rooms are decorated in shades of gray and burnt orange. Each of the hotel's 210 rooms come with modern amenities like Skype- and Bluetooth-enabled smart cordless phones and interactive room service consoles, as well as 300-thread-count Egyptian cotton bedding. Stay is also home to the trendy Aspen Social Club, a tapas restaurant and bar.

On the Ave.

Popular among student travelers and Columbia-visiting academics, this upper-Broadway hotel offers a surprising amount of comfort and style for an affordable price. The 282 streamlined rooms (many of which often go for well below \$300) all have beds with suede headboards, down duvets, and 300-thread-count Egyptian-cotton linens; other high-style touches include stainless-steel sinks and complimentary Godiva coffee. The 16th-floor garden terrace with its row of Adirondack chairs is a supreme summer lounging spot (the adjacent penthouse, No. 1602, has stunning views of the Hudson River and is worth the splurge).

Empire Hotel

Situated between Lincoln Center and Central Park, this hotel has 422 units, all of which have floor-to-ceiling windows to let in the best views. Although somewhat small, guest rooms are comfortable with rich earth tones, brass accents, and subtle animal prints. Chef Ed Brown's seafood shack, Ed's Chowder House feeds guests everything from lobster rolls to tuna steak frites and an array of oysters. During the summer, the rooftop deck and plunge pool on the 12th floor offers private cabana rentals with daybeds and flat screen TVs.
